PROBUS CANADA ELECTIONS – 2005

In keeping with the Constitution and Bylaws, elections were held to select persons to serve on the Board of Probus Centre-Canada for the next three years. There were calls for nominations to the Board with vacancies to be filled in three of the four regions of the country. There was no election in the Atlantic Region as Arthur Buck still has two years to serve.

In Ontario, there were elections in two Districts, # 5 and # 6. In District #5, there was one nomination to the Board and Mr. John Adams of the Probus Club of Wasaga Beach was declared elected by acclamation for a three year term to replace Director and Treasurer Betsy Eydt who retired after one three year term for personal reasons. In District #6, there were two candidates nominated in the persons of Douglas Eckels, Probus Club of Brantford and Beth Hickerson, Women’s Probus Club of Brant. With all sixteen of the Clubs in the District participating in the election, Beth Hickerson was re-elected to the Board for a second three year term.

In the area of Man./Sask./Ab. there was also only one nomination submitted and Gordon Smith of the Probus Club of Regina was declared elected by acclamation to replace retiring Director Don Putnam of the Probus Club of Winnipeg who retired after having served on the Board with distinction for six years.

In British Columbia, there were five candidates nominated for the one vacancy Norm Broughton of the Probus Club of Saanich; John Leonard of the Probus Club of North Shore Vancouver; Archie Nicol of the Probus Club of Chilliwack; Gordon Springate of the Probus Club of Kelowna; and Bill Verburgt of the Probus Club of Comox Valley.. Again, after excellent participation by twenty-seven of the thirty two Clubs across the province, Gordon Springate was successful in being elected for a three year term on the Board.

As he complimented the successful candidates on their election, President Ken Leaney also expressed appreciation to all who had allowed their names to stand and he complimented them on their willingness to serve as representatives of Probus across Canada.

He also praised those who had completed their terms on the Board and thanked them for their many hours of unselfish contribution to Probus and to our growth and development over these past years (**Betsy Eydt, Archie Nicol and Don Putnam**)
