The first Probust Canada President was John Morris of Alliston Ontario. The first Women's Club was the Probust Women's Club of Burlington. They received their charter October 10, 1990 and had 45 charter members. The Club was sponsored by Rotary Burlington.

During March 2007 it would be appropriate to celebrate this special 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Probust Canada. What better way to celebrate than by organizing another Club in your area? It would also be a good time to concentrate on developing more fun and fellowship in your Club. Get rid of the cliques and make new members welcome. ## WHERE ARE WE NOW ?

The new Membership Directory of Probus Clubs in Canada will be distributed to all Probus Clubs with updated information in January of 2007. We have now chartered 184 Probus Clubs in Canada and 181 are still active and well with just over 23,200 individual members. Throughout this newsletter you will read remarks from people suggesting that help is readily available if you see the need for an additional Club in your area or a new Club in an adjoining area. ## Probus Liability Insurance

The current Probus Liability Insurance covering all Probus Clubs who are members of Probus Canada is in effect until the end of 2006 at which time it will have been renewed for the year 2007 so coverage is continuous. Shortly after the new year, a renewal certificate will be issued to Probus Centre Canada and copies will be mailed to all Clubs immediately thereafter. This renewal certificate should be kept in a safe place along with the copy of the policy which has been distributed to all Clubs in the past.

## From Around the Clubs

## Constitution and Bylaws

You will recall that a proposal for a couple of changes in the Bylaws of Probus Centre-Canada, Inc. was circulated to all Clubs recently and the support for change from the Clubs across the country was most positive with over 97% of the votes received being for the change. The proposal is now in the hands of the Government of Canada and, if the changes receive their approval, the revised document will be circulated to all Clubs in the new year. At the same time, it is planned that the Suggested Constitution & Bylaws for local Clubs (guidelines) will be updated to reflect the changes and will be distributed as well.

Regular Probus lapel pins are \$5.50 each in orders of less than 25 but only \$4.50 each in orders of 25 or more.

The 5, 10 and 15 year pins are \$5.50 each regardless of number ordered and the President pin, the Probus Canada pin and the Past President pin are \$8.00 each regardless of the number ordered.

## POCKET CRESTS

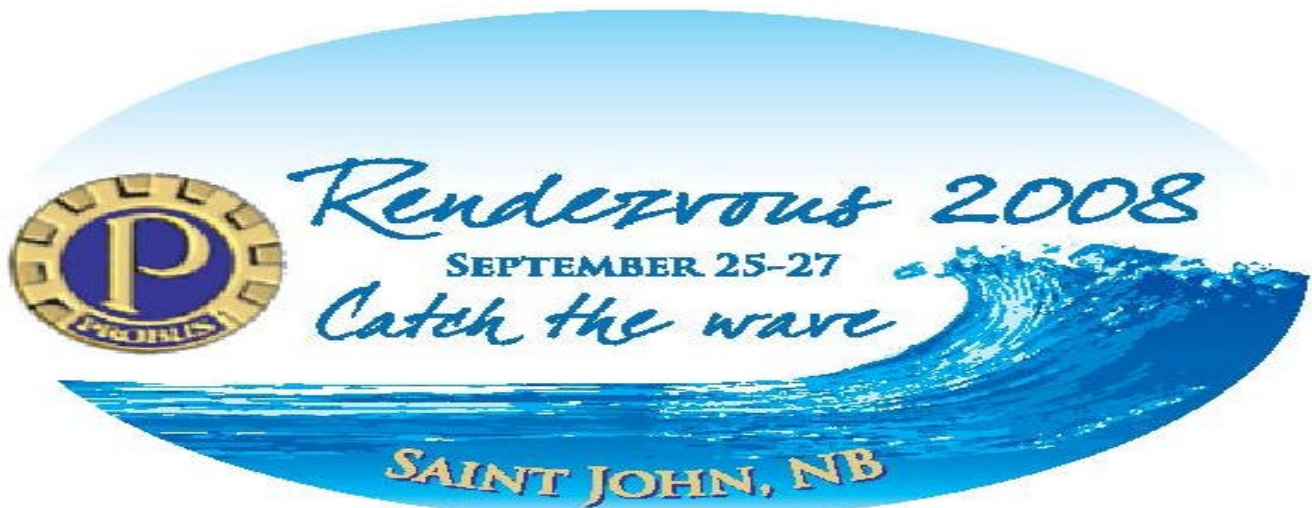
