This is a very preliminary notification and there are many details to be put into place. You will hear much more about it in the weeks and months ahead so please watch for special mailings and think about a holiday in late September, 2005 where you will have the opportunity to meet and share experiences with many fellow Probus Members.

I am truly excited about the year ahead as your national President and I promise to do my best to support and extend the aims and objects of Probus which is essentially "fellowship and learning" and I encourage you to work with me as we share our good fortune with others who have the same interests and desires as we do.

ELECTIONS- BOARD of DIRECTORS - PROBUS CENTRE-CANADA, INC.

On December 10, 2002, a mailing was forwarded to each and every Member Club of Probus Centre-Canada, Inc. advising of the "Call for Nominations" to the Board of Directors of Probus Centre-Canada, Inc. There were three (3) positions open for nomination in Ontario and one (1) position in British Columbia. In B.C. there were two nominations received for the one position and in Ontario, there were twelve nominations received for the three positions open. In the subsequent elections, in B.C., Ken Leaney of the Parksville Club was re-elected for a second three year term on the Board and in Ontario, Maureen Huisman of Women's Newmarket was re-elected for a second three year term, while Nancy Troyak of Women's Kitchener and Eric W. Van Allen of "Old" Oakville were elected for a first three year term. Our compliments to all of the successful candidates as well as our appreciation to all who allowed their names to stand in nomination! We hope this interest in serving on the national Board will continue in the years ahead. The response to the election call was excellent from the Clubs in both regions. Ballots were returned from over 90% of the Clubs in Ontario and close to 80% in British Columbia and the newly elected representatives have already participated in their first meeting.

At the same time as we elect new Members to the Board, we must pay tribute to those who retire and our sincere appreciation goes to Jim Coombs, Ottawa-Rideau and to Beverley Miller, Women's Waterloo for their dedication and outstanding service on the national Board and to the Probus Clubs across Canada.

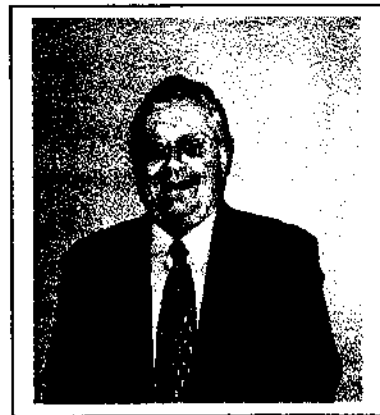
