How did it all start in 1996

The network was originally called the Informal PROBUS Network but was changed to the International PROBUS Network after PROBUS members joined from more countries.

Wilf Beer of the Woy Woy PROBUS Club Inc.Australia had the initial idea to form a series of Chat Groups to give Global PROBUS members the opportunity of meeting together on the internet to discuss PROBUS TOPICS among themselves - excluding political and religious topics.

So a new kind of PROBUS Fellowship was formed in 1996 on the Net with IPN A1. with 13 members from Australia, Canada, New Zealand.

Several experimental network solutions were tried initially but as membership increased more groups were formed and in 2000 there were 166 members in 5 groups for management.

When Topical Probe, the network option in MSN closed, a private Facebook group was set up but has now been withdrawn in light of the privacy problems of Facebook, such as unwanted attention

Today 2018 we have two groups, IPNCAN and IPNUK with 2 group coordinators and a Senior/ Membership Coordinator.
